*Whereas, Red vs Blue encourages waste reduction and using resources wisely to save natural resources and provide for future generations and*


*Whereas, Red vs Blue challenges local government, schools, businesses and concerned citizens to work together to recycle more and to adopt environmentally sustainable practices*


